

## New Fellowships at Syracuse University's Maxwell School Available to CHCI Interns

Washington, D.C. – **The Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University recently announced a new fellowship program for Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute (CHCI) interns.** Students who are current or former CHCI interns and who are admitted to the MPA and/or **MA International Relations (IR)** degree programs now qualify for a tuition scholarship valued at \$10,000.

The new CHCI Maxwell Fellowship awards will be provided to eligible students admitted into Maxwell's MPA, MA IR, or any other Public Administration (PA)/IR joint degree, with the exception of dual JD degree candidates. CHCI interns will also be considered for additional funding through the department's traditional awards process. A letter of support attesting to the successful completion of their internship will be required for the official administration of these awards.

Creation of the fellowships builds on more than 10 years of successful collaboration between CHCI and Maxwell's Department of Public Administration and International Affairs (PAIA), says Christine Omolino, director of admission and financial for PAIA. "These fellowships serve as testament to our commitment to a diverse public service and in recognition of the talented individuals that CHCI mentors throughout the year," Omolino says. "We have appreciated the opportunity to showcase the versatility of graduate degrees in the fields of public policy, administration, and international affairs to talented and promising young professionals that CHCI brings to Washington, D.C., each semester for their internship programs. We expect these new Fellowships to strengthen this already well-established partnership."
