

CARECEN Celebrates 31 Years of Service to the Latino Community in the Washington Region

Washington, DC – The Central American Resource Center (CARECEN) will host its annual Anniversary Reception and Awards Ceremony on October 11, 2012 at the beautiful Josephine Butler Parks Center in Washington, DC. The event celebrates CARECEN's 31 years of working with and for the Latino community in the Washington, DC area. We anticipate that more than 150 guests will join us for award presentations, hors d'oeuvres and an open bar, a Latin American themed silent auction and live music.

Over the past year CARECEN has continued to work tirelessly to better the lives of Latin American immigrants. We have:
