

VICTOR CRUZ, SONIA MANZANO, CARMELO ANTHONY, MAYRA SANTOS-FEBRES, AND MORE, AT NATIONAL PUERTO RICAN DAY PARADE 2012

New York City, NY - New York's landmark Fifth Avenue will once again shine with Puerto Rican pride and culture, as the **17th Annual National Puerto Rican Day Parade** (55th annual Puerto Rican Day Parade since the event's inception as a local organization), will take place on Sunday, June 10, 2012.

In a press conference held Tuesday, May 15th, at **Banco Popular** in Lower Manhattan, **Madelyn Lugo**, the Parade's Chairperson, announced that this year's Parade theme is "**Puerto Ricans and Higher Education**", in recognition of the outstanding achievements and contribution of Puerto Ricans at all-levels in adult and continuing education. The Parade's Grand Marshal is **Dr. Félix Matos-Rodríguez**, President of **Hostos Community College** (CUNY). The Godfather is **Manuel J. Fernós**, President of Puerto Rico's **Inter-American University**.

"The National Puerto Rican Day Parade remains the premiere family event that celebrates Puerto Rican pride and culture from around the world. This year we have an exciting line-up of honorees whose work has empowered and inspired countless others. I invite everyone to join us on June 10th for our glorious Parade celebration", Lugo said.

New York Giants' superstar **Victor Cruz** will march as Athlete of the Year. The 2012 New York Godmother is actress and author **Sonia Manzano**, a pioneer in Public Television. The Lifetime Achievement Award will be presented to **María Román Dumén**, Co-Founder of the National Puerto Rican Day Parade, Inc. The Executive of the Year is **Raul Russi**, CEO of Acacia Network, Inc., for his outstanding contribution to the Parade.

The Parade will be dedicated to the hometown of **Guayama** (38 miles south of San Juan), marking the 276th anniversary of its foundation. The State dedication went to **Ohio**, where the Puerto Rican population reached 94,965 in 2010, according to the U.S. Census.

Lugo announced that the Parade will conduct a voter registration awareness campaign called “*Voto Boricua*” (Puerto Rican Vote). The Parade will also continue its environmental awareness campaign in partnership with the **Sierra Club**, and will pay a special tribute to Puerto Rico's Inter-American University on its 100th Anniversary.

The 17th Annual National Puerto Rican Day Parade (55th Annual Puerto Rican Day Parade in New York) will begin at 11:00 am on 44th Street, making its way north along Fifth Avenue to 79th Street. The event will be broadcast live by **Fox 5/MY9**, and in Puerto Rico through **Telemundo of Puerto Rico**.

Lugo and the Parade's Board of Directors called on parade marchers and spectators to display Puerto Rican flags without any symbols.
